This assignment is due on the first day of school in August for both first and second semester students. A detailed, major test on this novel will be given the second day of class. This assignment must be typed in Times New Roman 12 point font and double spaced. Use the outline below as a format for the paper. **Label each section.** **A title page** with the name of the book, student name, and Semester 1 or 2 is required. Students will circle the semester number when they find out which semester they have English on the first day of school. Staple all the pages together.

- I. Research the author and write a short summary on her life. **(at least ½ page)**
- II. Research smallpox and the epidemics of smallpox throughout history. **(at least ½ page)**

(This is NOT your opinion or other students' opinions.)

*Sources for literary criticism may include the Internet, books, etc.

(Goodreads website is not acceptable.)

*Remember that literary criticism may be positive or negative.

*Cite your sources by making bibliography entries. *Writer's Inc.* books and/or Internet will explain the correct MLA bibliographic form.
