English I Honors is the first step in a sequence of accelerated English courses. This course reinforces and pursues mastery of thinking, speaking, reading, and writing skills begun in grades 1-8. The English I curriculum covers assignments in grammar, communication, writing, research, logic, informational text, media, and literature. Outside reading is required each nine weeks period in addition to regular classroom assignments. Students will be expected to read, comprehend, and write at ninth grade level. **Students must attain a passing average of 60 to complete requirements for English I credit.**
